Biography

For several years, Michael acted for BTA Bank on the largest fraud ever to come before the English Courts (and involving satellite proceedings in numerous other jurisdictions). In 2013, Hogan Lovells was awarded the The Lawyer's 'Litigation Team of the Year' award for its ground-breaking work on the BTA Bank case.

More recently, Michael was successful in securing a landmark victory at the Court of Appeal for client ENRC against the UK Serious Fraud Office in a historic decision which will have lasting implications for the law

In addition to litigation in England, Michael also has significant experience litigating in off-shore jurisdictions, including the BVI, the Cayman Islands, Jersey and Cyprus. He was also previously based in Hogan Lovells' New York office.
